



# FROM THE DRAWING BOARD

**As your architects it is great to be involved with this project and to see the detailed scheme continue to emerge. Over the last few months we have been coordinating the various other professionals required to feed into the detailed design. The Structural, Electrical and Heating Engineers are all working up their proposals in relation to the architectural scheme and we are drawing their expertise into the overall design package.**

**This is all starting to come together and we will be keeping your 10:10 committee very busy over the next few weeks discussing our detailed proposals and the overall technical design to ensure that things are progressing in the direction the church family want. As we become immersed in the technical ‘nuts and bolts’ of building we don’t want to lose sight of the church members, user groups and all people who will encounter your building. This will be at the forefront of our thoughts as we coordinate everything from the colour of the meeting room doors to the reuse of rainwater in the toilets as part of a holistic technical design.**

# NEXT STEPS

The church is currently undergoing various checks and tests before we can commence the new building works. This information is required before we can go out to tender to the building contractors. We have had an asbestos survey and we are now starting to open up areas within the worship space so we can see the existing structure of the roof space, walls and in particular the wall above the worship space and the current hall.

The internal design is at an exciting stage as we discuss the finer points of floor and wall finishes and the exact locations of the rooms. There are no less than three kitchen areas in the building: a community café, a training kitchen and a kitchen to be used by the business area upstairs. The café will be at the heart of the building so we are working on a design that will be current, welcoming and functional. The challenge is to maximise its openness but also clarify when it's closed, without actually screening it off. The training kitchen will be stainless steel and catering grade, with the one upstairs more modest, functional but perfectly formed!

Working on the particular design details brings home how close we are to getting started on the build!

The funding has always been an important issue. We currently have submitted various grants and we are meeting with the National Lottery over the next week, submitting applications to various other trust funds and foundations. We have submitted a grant for EU funding and we will hear on the outcome for this in the summer.


